



EXHIBITION PROCEDURES / INFORMATION 2010

The Washington Art Association is a nonprofit, volunteer organization. Exhibitions are selected to provide wide variety, superior quality and public interest throughout the year. The Exhibition Committee of the Washington Art Association will consider applications for exhibitions in 2010 on the following terms:

Artists should submit a resume and 12-20 images of work completed in the past two years with a corresponding image list including title, date, dimensions and medium. Images may be submitted in either slide or JPG (72dpi / 300dpi) form. If you wish to bring in original works, at least 5 examples must be submitted along with resume, etc. Submissions will be reviewed by WAA's exhibition committee, which next meets on:

March 31, 2009 at 6:30pm.

DEADLINE OCTOBER 1, 2009 FOR YOUNG TALENT EXHIBITION 2010

Open to artists who are not currently students and 30 years or under by 1/ 2010. Artists should submit a resume including date of birth and 12-20 images of work completed in the past year with a corresponding list, including title, date, dimensions and medium. Images may be submitted in either slide or JPEG form. Submissions will be reviewed by WAA's exhibition committee, which meets on an ongoing basis. Please include SASE for return of all submitted materials. Work received without SASE and not accepted for exhibition, will be discarded. Washington Art Association, Att: Young Talent, P.O. Please include SASE (self-addressed-stamped-envelope) with adequate postage for the return of all submitted materials. Work received without a SASE with sufficient postage that is not accepted for exhibition at the WAA will be discarded.

If your work is accepted for exhibition, the Washington Art Association will send you a complete list of guidelines outlining artists' responsibilities for the exhibit. The following includes some information from that list:

The Washington Art Association will deduct and retain a commission of 35% on all sales made or contracted for during the show.

Exhibitors are responsible for the cost of their announcements that the WAA designs. Artists exhibiting at the same time share the cost.

Hanging is subject to the approval of the Exhibition Committee. A show chairperson is assigned to each exhibition and is available to assist the artists and answer any questions.

Work will be insured only while on exhibition at the gallery. The Association will take every possible care in handling work, but is not responsible for any loss or damage to pieces not picked up promptly when the show comes down. There will be a storage charge for work left at the gallery after a show ends.
